

# Module 4: Website Management

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## 4.1 Creating Websites: Adding New Websites and Subdomains

CyberPanel simplifies the process of creating websites by offering a streamlined interface to add new websites or subdomains.

### 4.1.1 Steps to Create a New Website

1. **Log in to CyberPanel:** Access the CyberPanel admin interface via your server IP or domain.
2. **Navigate to "Websites":** From the left-side menu, click on "Websites" and then select "Create Website."
3. **Enter Website Details:**
  - **Select Owner:** Choose the user account (admin or another created user) under which the website will be managed.
  - **Domain Name:** Input the domain or subdomain name for the website.
  - **Select PHP Version:** Choose the PHP version your website will use (CyberPanel allows you to

select different PHP versions for different websites).

- **Options:** You can choose to enable SSL, DKIM support, and other features during this step.

4. **Create Website:** Click "Create Website" to complete the process. CyberPanel will automatically create a document root for the website and configure basic settings.



## 4.1.2 Adding Subdomains

1. **Navigate to "Create Website":** Follow the same process as above.

2. **Enter Subdomain:** Instead of entering a primary domain, enter the subdomain you want to create (e.g., ).
3. **Link to Main Domain:** Subdomains will inherit certain settings from the main domain, but you can manage them independently in terms of files, SSL, and database management.

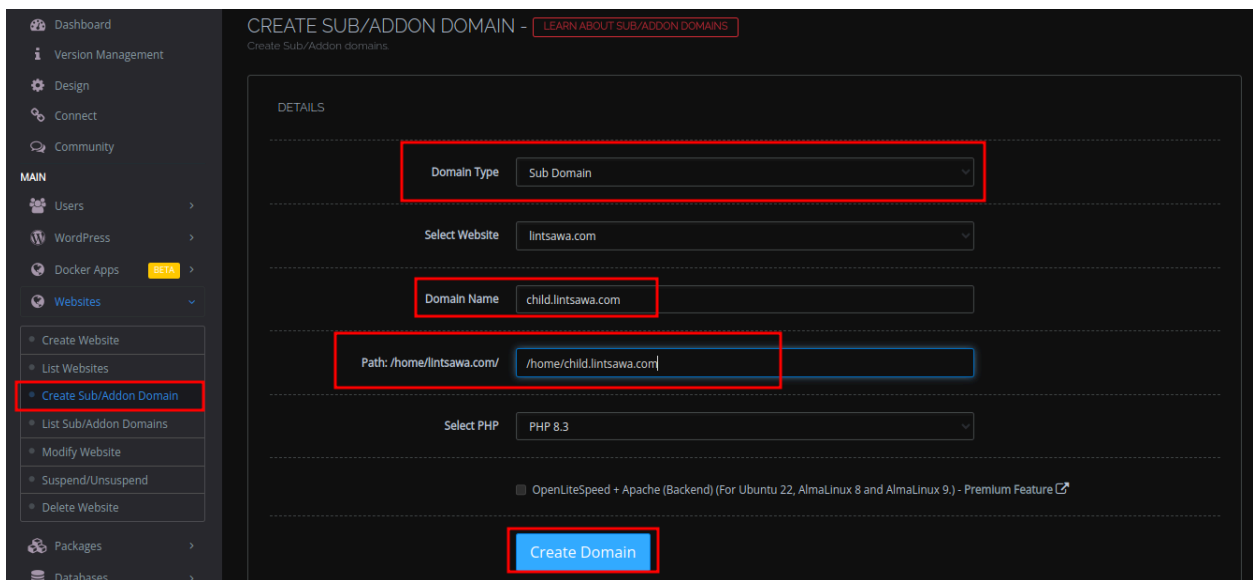
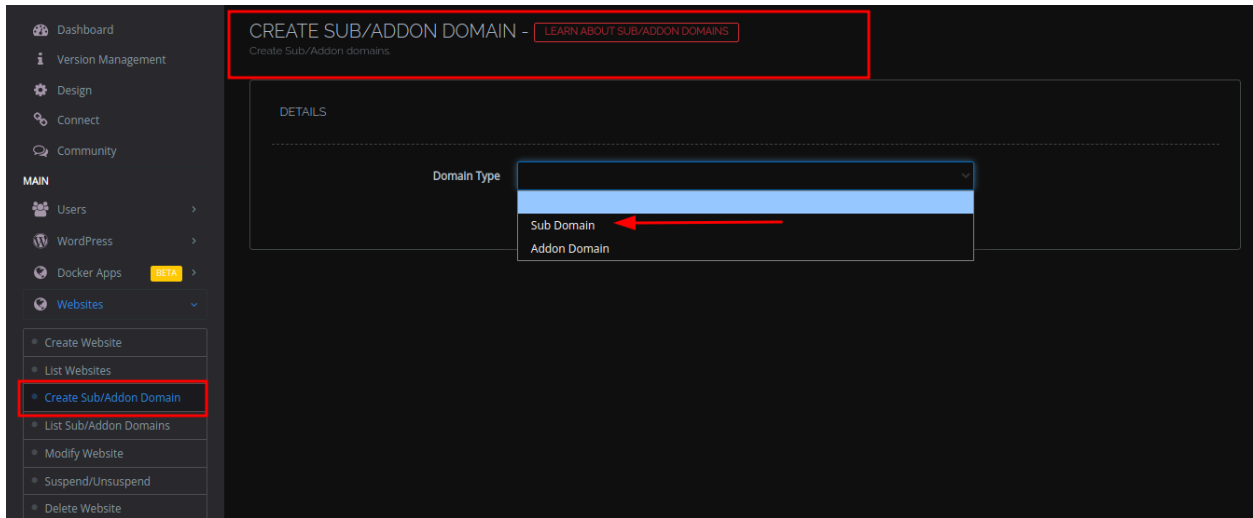

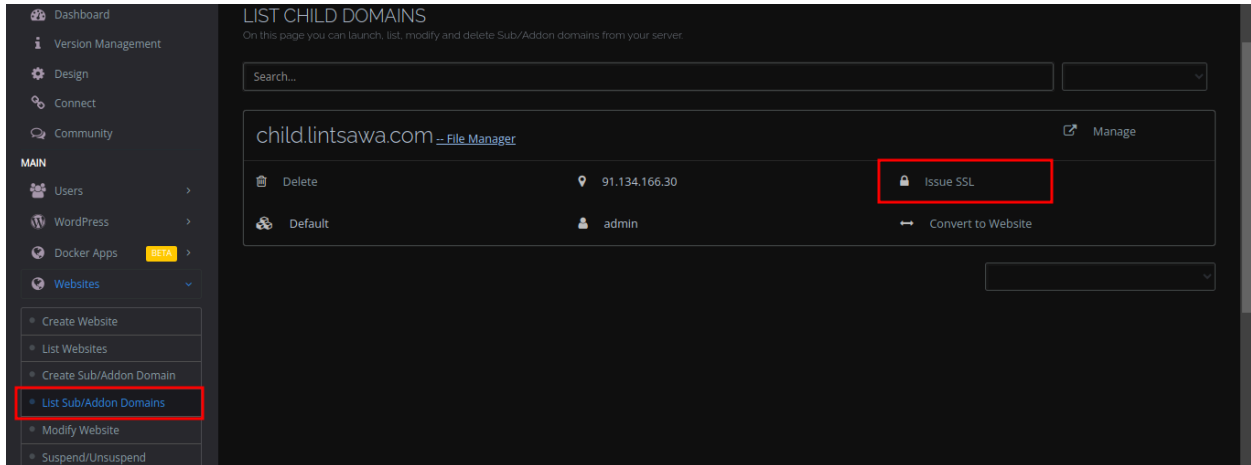

### 4.1.3 SSL Setup for Websites and Subdomains

- Once a website or subdomain is created, you can issue an SSL certificate by navigating to the "SSL" section under the website management menu. CyberPanel integrates with Let's Encrypt, allowing you to set up SSL certificates with a few clicks.



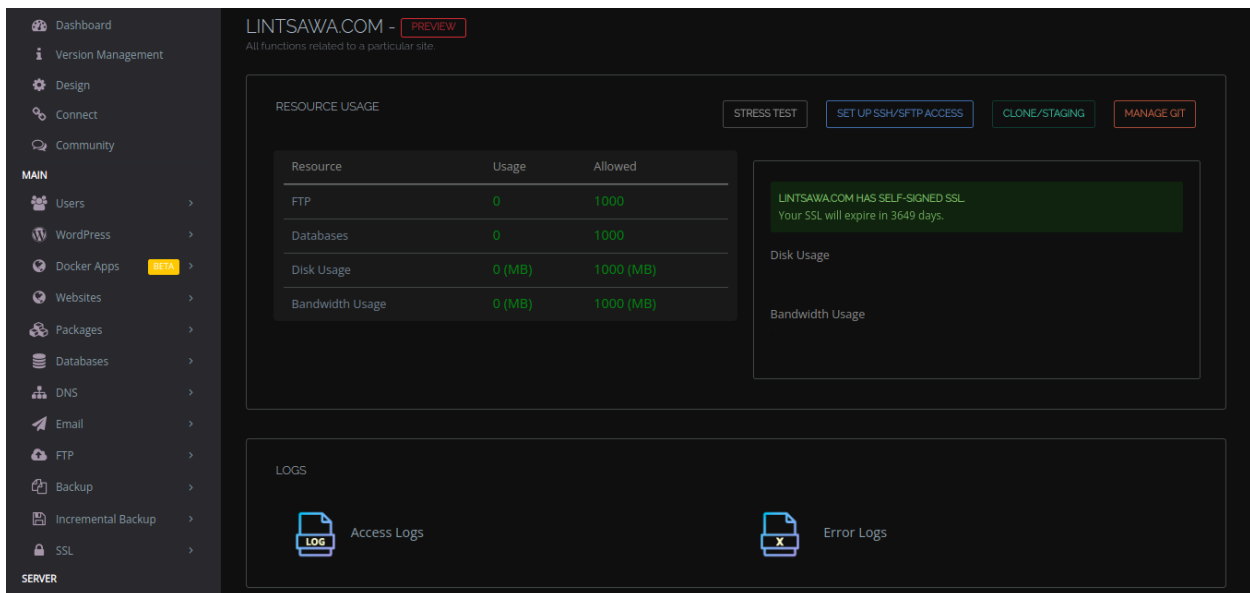
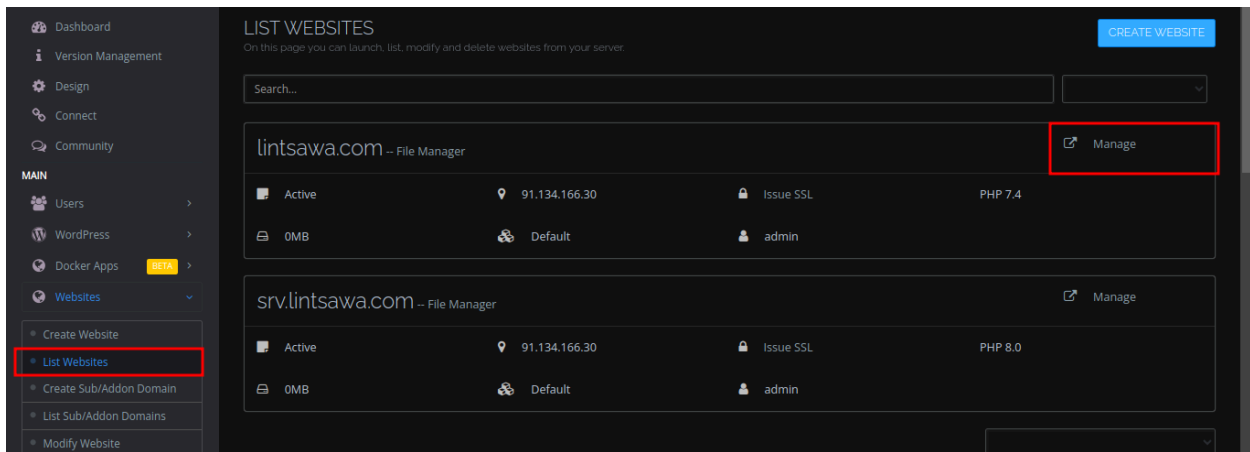
## 4.2 Managing Existing Websites: Modifying Website Settings

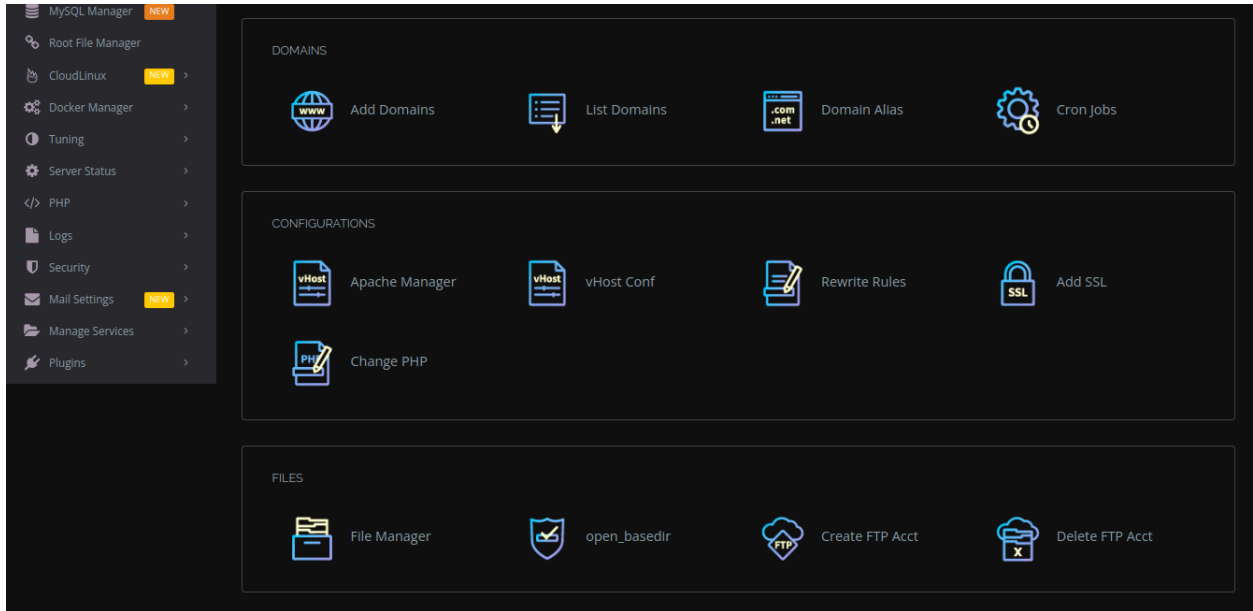
CyberPanel allows easy access to modify your websites' settings. Once your website is created, you can make changes to its configuration based on your needs.

### 4.2.1 Modifying Website Details

1. **Navigate to "List Websites"**: In the "Websites" section, click on "List Websites" to see all the websites hosted on your server.
2. **Select the Website**: Click on the "Manage" button next to the website you wish to edit.
3. **Website Management Options**: From here, you can access various options:
  - **SSL**: Manage or renew SSL certificates.
  - **File Manager**: Upload, edit, or delete website files.

- **Modify PHP Config:** Adjust PHP settings such as memory limits, post limits, execution time, etc.
- **Change Document Root:** You can modify the document root if needed.
- **Git Integration:** Integrate Git to deploy code directly to your website.
- **Delete Website:** Remove the website from the server if necessary.

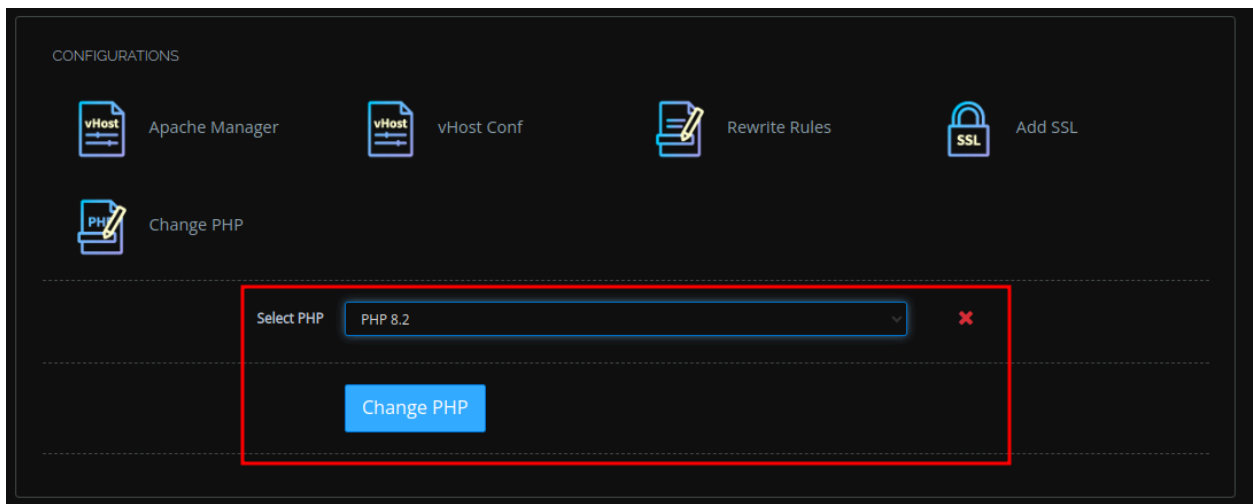
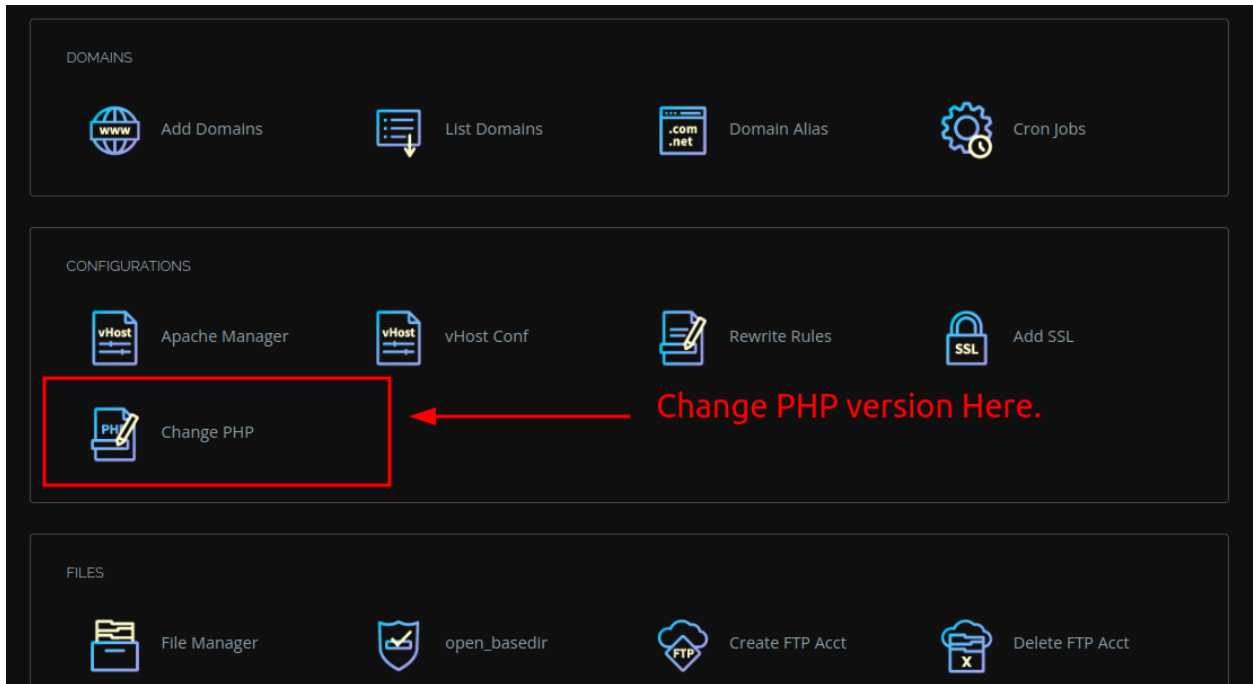




## 4.2.2 Changing PHP Version for an Existing Website

CyberPanel allows you to change the PHP version for an existing website:

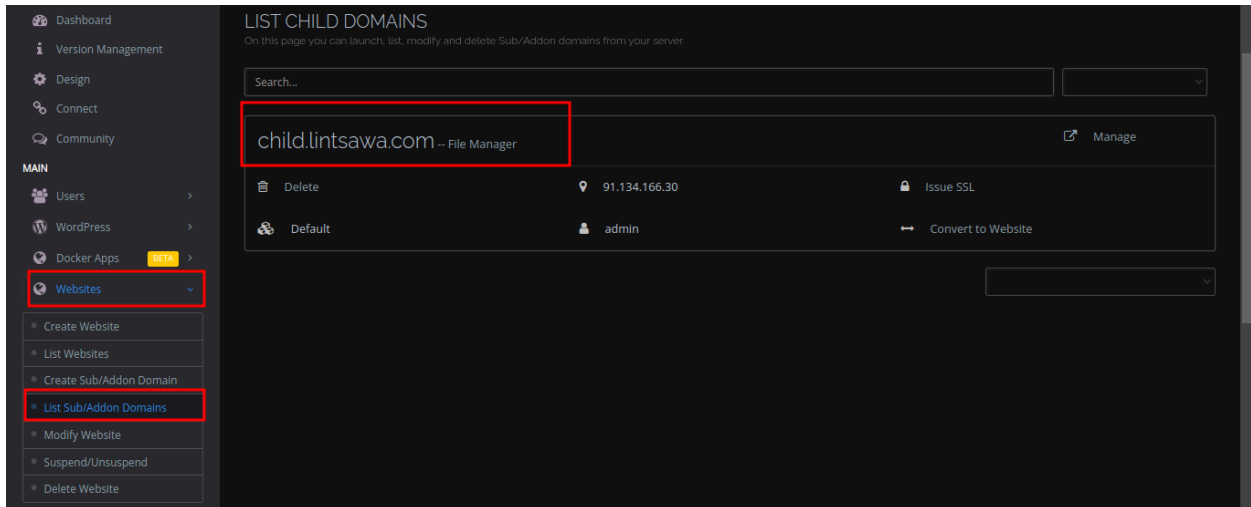
1. **Select Website:** Go to the "Websites" section and choose "List Websites."
2. **Click on "Manage":** Under the selected website, you will find the option to "Change PHP Version."
3. **Select PHP Version:** Choose the PHP version you want to switch to, then apply the changes.



## 4.2.3 Managing Subdomains

Subdomains are managed similarly to primary domains. You can access the settings for subdomains from the "Websites" section, where subdomains are listed alongside their main domains. You'll see

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## 4.3 Uploading and Managing Files: File Manager Basics and FTP Access

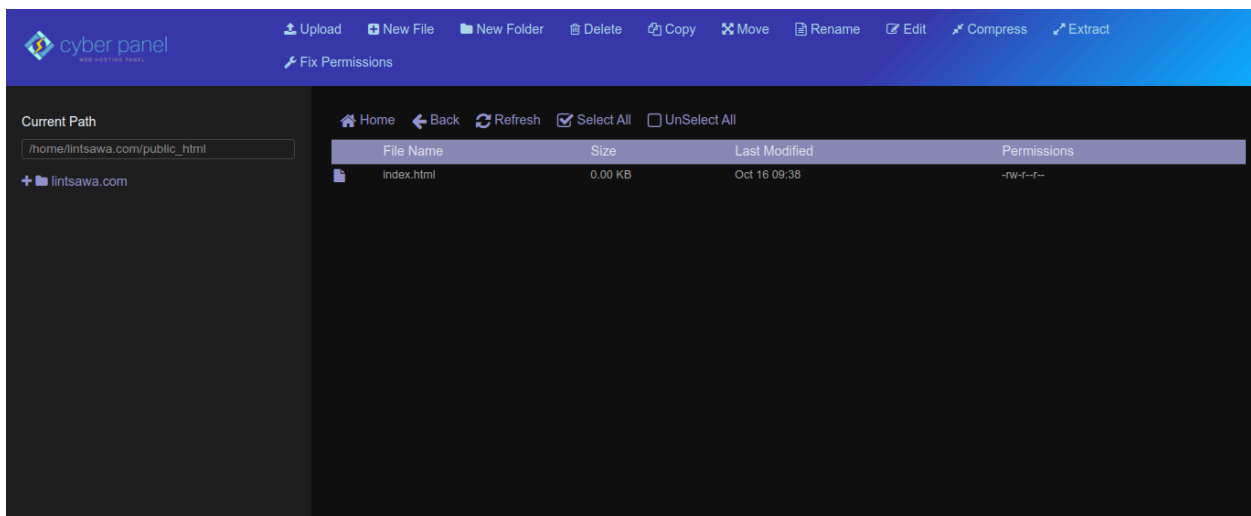
Managing website files is an essential part of maintaining a website. CyberPanel offers two main methods for managing files: the built-in file manager and FTP.

### 4.3.1 Using the CyberPanel File Manager

CyberPanel's file manager provides an easy way to upload and manage files directly from the dashboard.

- 1. Access the File Manager:** From the "Websites" section, select "List Websites," then click "Manage" for the desired website. Click "File Manager" to open the file management interface.
- 2. File Manager Functions:**

- **Upload Files:** You can drag and drop files or use the upload button to add files to the document root.
- **Edit Files:** You can directly edit text-based files (e.g., HTML, PHP, CSS, JS) in the built-in editor.
- **Create Folders:** Organize your files into directories for better management.
- **File Permissions (Fix Permissions):** Adjust file or folder permissions as needed.
- **Download Files:** You can download files or folders to your local system.
- **Others :** Creating New files, Deleting, Moving, Renaming, Compressing



### 4.3.2 FTP Access

If you prefer to manage files via FTP, CyberPanel provides a simple process for creating and managing FTP accounts.

## 1. Create FTP Account:

- Go to the "FTP" section from the main dashboard and click on "Create FTP Account."
- Assign the FTP account to a specific domain and set the document root for that account.

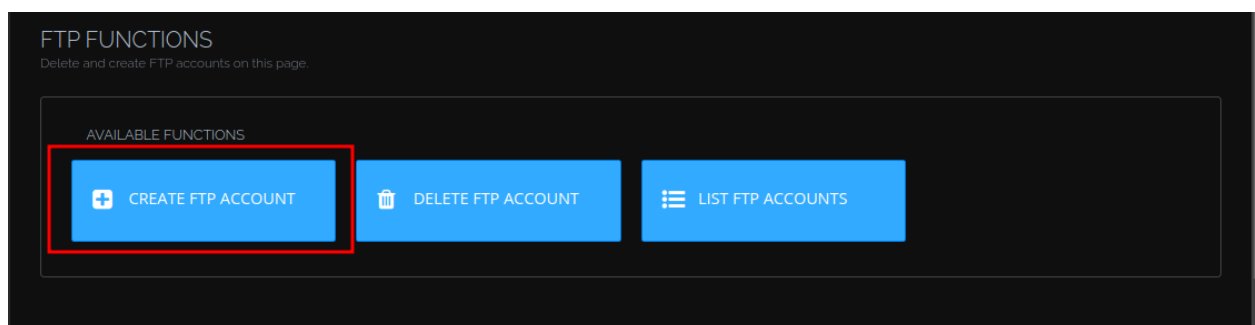
## 2. FTP Client: Use an FTP client such as FileZilla or Cyberduck to connect to your server. The connection details will include:

- **Host:** Your server IP or domain name.
- **Username:** The FTP username you created.
- **Password:** The FTP password.
- **Port:** 21 (for standard FTP) or 22 (for SFTP if you want to use a secure connection).

## 3. Managing Files via FTP: Once connected, you can upload, delete, or manage files as you would through the file manager.

### 4.3.3 Best Practices for File Management

- **Keep Backups:** Always maintain a backup of your files before making significant changes.
- **Organize Files:** Use folders to organize different file types (e.g., separating media from scripts).
- **Use Secure FTP:** SFTP (Secure FTP) is recommended over standard FTP to protect your data during transfer.
